

Reparations Grants Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

- 1. What are the 5 pillars of the Reparations Task Force?
- Education
- Health care/elder care
- Affordable housing
- Environmental degradation
- Job creation/micro-economic investment
- 2. Regarding education: does the program or service have to take place during a specific time during school, after school, summer, weekdays or are all times acceptable?
- A program does not need to be defined by school hours. Provide full details on the intended program whenever it is scheduled to take place.
- 3. Please give some examples of environmental degradation and of projects to improve it.
- Examples of environmental degradation are a lack of trees and green spaces, trashfilled areas, or toxic water systems.
- Examples of projects or programs to improve environmental degradation are sampling of water systems in schools to prevent lead pipe issues; water system upgrades in schools that address lead pipe issues; and development of community gardens.
- 4. What are the geographical areas these grants can serve?
- The information web page, including a map of the geographical region, can be found here - https://episcopalmaryland.org/reparations-grants/. The Diocese of Maryland spans across 10 counties in western, central and southern Maryland – Allegany, Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Calvert, Carroll, Frederick, Garrett, Harford, Howard, and Washington, and the independent city of Baltimore.
- 5. Non-profit establishment requires fees paid to both the IRS and to Maryland. Can an applicant ask for those startup costs?
- Yes, but these costs must be fully explained in the application.



- 6. We are a startup who has a 501(c)(3). How do you view the lack of 990 long forms or audits, and non-profits with small budgets under \$5,000?
- Lack of 990s for startups will have no negative impact on scoring. However, you must attach a 3-to-5-year plan with full budget projections, which show the complete vision for the project.
- 7. Does the job creation pillar this include workforce development programs?
- Yes
- 8. Are funds allowed to be used for two separate programs?
- Yes. However, the use of the funds must be clearly described in your application.

- 10. Will there be PDF of the application available?
- No
- 11. Will there be a process for monitoring the funds that are granted?
- Yes, records must be kept and a report will be required demonstrating how the funds have been used.
- 12. Does the project we are requesting funds for must impact the entire geographical area of the Diocese of Maryland?
- No. A project can impact a specific area or community as long as that community is primarily African American.
