

#### **Budget Process**

The Diocese of Maryland canons delegate the budget process to the program and budget committee with visioning and input generated through regional councils. Historically, at least one person from each region along with Diocesan staff would make up this committee.


The regional representative would obtain input from the churches in each region by way of the regional councils. In recent years, participation in both the regional councils and program and budget process has dwindled leaving a much smaller group to present a balanced budget to Diocesan Council for their approval in December.

At its September meeting (minutes not yet approved/published), the Council expressed a desire to maintain current programming until the new Bishop Coadjutor is available to participate in budget visioning for the future. This process would include discussing the regional council structure and its relationship to the program and budget committee. Council also approved exceeding the expense budget by 5% due to increased property care expenses.

The Claggett Center and Sutton Scholars boards prepare separate budgets that are also reviewed and approved by Diocesan Council.



#### 2023 Diocesan of Maryland Operating Budget - \$5,566,200






#### **2023 Diocesan of Maryland Operating Budget**

The Diocese of Maryland operating budget is divided into six categories. We will review each category in detail, and then review the revenue sources that fund this budget. There are three other Diocesan Funds with separate budgeting processes that we will review briefly at the end of this presentation – The Claggett Center, Sutton Scholars, and The Middendorf Fund.


#### **Truth & Reconciliation Commission and Reparations Taskforce**

The work of reconciliation is a fundamental calling for the Diocese of Maryland. The Truth and Reconciliation Commission is an ongoing commission focused on enhancing existing efforts to eradicate racism, researching the history of slavery in our diocese and its residual impact, as well as reparations. The reparations taskforce instituted a grantmaking process during 2022 and distributed \$175,000 to organizations committed to reparations. 

#### 2023 Ministry of Communications Highlights – 4% of the Budget

The communications budget funds programmatic costs such as the Diocesan website, biweekly eNews distribution, Maryland Episcopalian online magazine, public relations, and live-streaming support for online worship at The Cathedral of the Incarnation. The communications department also offers web development services to our churches for a negotiable fee based on need.


The budget also allows for high-speed Internet access, leasing of printers and copiers at the Diocesan Center, and computer equipment/software used by Diocesan Staff. Finally, the technical information technology services required to operate the equipment are outsourced to a contractor.

#### Staff Compensation and Benefits - \$2,250,000 - 40.42%







#### **2023 Ministry of Operations Highlights – 14% of the Budget**

#### **Business Operations**

Costs for telephones, business travel, bank fees, interest, postage, and office supplies represent 24% of the operations budget.

#### **Diocesan Center Operations**

This category consists of all expenses relating to operating the Diocesan Center facility and The Cathedral of the Incarnation including supplies, repairs, utilities, lawncare, building manager, and custodial staff. The Cathedral congregation reimburses a portion of the cost and has been asked to increase their contribution as the costs to operate the center have increased. Total cost to operate the building represent 38% of the operations budget. Larger capital improvements are typically shared between the Cathedral congregation and the Property Care budget.

#### **Diocesan Property Care**

In addition to the Diocesan Center and Cathedral Property, the Diocese is responsible for the following additional properties:

Clover Hill House – historic former Bishop's residence now rented to clergy

4 closed churches being prepared for sale

4 closed churches used by other organizations

11 mission churches

5 cemetery properties

As churches close, the Diocese becomes responsible for maintenance and disposition or reuse of the property, typically with costly deferred maintenance.



#### **Diocesan Property Care**

The costs of maintaining these properties has been significantly over budget in both 2021 and 2022. In 2021, \$140,000 in one-time significant repairs were made while in 2022, large repairs of \$175,000 were made to replace boilers, repair roofs, repaint, upgrade lighting, etc. Each year the Diocesan Council has approved additional funds over the \$300,000 budget as projects were completed.

When properties are sold, the funds are typically designated to the proceeds from property sales endowment fund. These funds have been spent by Diocesan Council on new ministry starts, capital improvements, costs to prepare properties for sale, and debt reduction.

#### **Shared Ministry Allocation**

The Diocese of Maryland has two calculations for the shared allocation each church contributes to the Diocesan budget.

#### FORMULA -- The lesser of:

A) 18% (.18) of the average of the 2019, 2020 and 2021 normal operating income less: 4% (.04) of the 2021 normal operating expense

less: \$2,860

#### OR

B) 18% (.18) of the 2021 normal operating income

less: 4% (.04) of the 2021 normal operating expense

less: \$2,860

Effectively, this formula ensures that congregations of lesser financial means contributed 10% of average normal operating income or less while congregations of greater financial means contribute 12-14% of average normal operating income. No church contributes more than 14% for 2023.

#### 2023 Diocese of Maryland Operating Revenue Highlights

#### **Endowment Income**

The Diocesan Investment Fund contains over 350 sub-funds and totals approximately \$35,000,000. Per church canons, the Diocese may draw up to 5% for restricted and unrestricted spending each year but has averaged spending of approximately 4.5%. The proceeds from property sales fund and the Reparations fund are both also included in the Diocesan Investment Fund.

#### **Bishop's Annual Appeal**

The annual fundraising effort generates approximately \$150,000 for the next year's operating budget. Most contributions are designated to the greatest need, but some donors support specific ministries

#### **Miscellaneous Revenue**

Rental revenue and facilities usage fees. The 2022 projection is higher than budget due to the Employee Retention Tax Credit.

#### **Claggett Camp and Conference Center**

The Diocese of Maryland owns the Claggett Camp and Conference Center near Frederick, Maryland. Prior to COVID-19, the center generated sufficient net assets to operate and maintain it's physical plant. While the operations were impacted by the pandemic, the hope is to return to profitability in 2024. Bequests and donations received prior to the pandemic generated sufficient cash flow to operate through the first quarter of 2022, though borrowing is now being utilized to maintain cash flow.

To meet these needs in the community, Sutton Scholars provides five weeks of curriculum on the campus of Mercy High School, teaching time management skills; workplace etiquette; healthy interpersonal communications and conflict

resolution strategies; relational, emotional, nutritional and physical health; financial skills; and other selected life skills to the students. Over \$1.8 million in grants and contributions have funded this program since its inception in 2015.

#### The Middendorf Fund

The Middendorf Fund is an endowment that was established to fund low interest loans to congregations and missions of the Diocese to assist in the construction, renovation and improvement of church property. As of September 30, 2022, the endowment balance was \$3,668,421 with an additional \$372,713 in cash and outstanding loans to 15 congregations totaling \$2,209,032 and a total fund value of \$6,250,166.

At the beginning of 2022, the trustees voted to reduce all interest rates to zero percent both to assist churches with debt reduction and encourage churches to complete necessary repairs or replace aging building systems. The trustees plan to review this provision on an annual basis.
